What makes me unique?

In English, we have been using our learning on An Inspector Calls (Year 10) and Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde (Year 11) to answer the termly enquiry question. Year 10 have been looking at social class and different political views and Year 11 have been learning about personalities and reputation. We have written about our own opinions, how we see the world and different topics, as well as what makes us different to everyone else. In maths we have learnt that Penrose tiling is a pattern of regular tiles which can cover a plane (tessellate) but does so in a non-repeating or unique pattern. During our geography lessons children have been comparing our local human and natural environments to those found around the world. They have further been identifying unique factors in their own environments. Over the term in Biology, pupils have been exploring the world of DNA and the fact that unless you are an identical twin no one in the world has the same DNA sequence. In BTEC Home Cooking children have continued to make their own dishes whilst independently following a recipe and making their own adjustments to meet their own unique tastes.



River Sleat Trip

On Tuesday 12th October the upper school campus went on a school trip to Sleaford, all children took part in a geography fieldwork trip in the morning along the River Sleat. The River Sleat is unique to our school because after our logo redesign our house names were changed to rivers and waterways around Lincolnshire due to our Grantham Road campus being situated on a river and the strong local links. During the fieldwork, children had the opportunity to learn about different characteristics of the river; upper course, middle course and lower course.

In the afternoon, our children split off into two groups based on their option choices. Our Art students went to the local art gallery (The Hub) and explored the art within the gallery before creating their own art pieces and displaying them in the gallery.


